- Mindy Wilkins with the Historic Trust shared they are currently accepting applications for the 2024 Marshall Leadership Awards for both youth and adults. - Chris Thobaben with Lumen Fedelis shared about their Safe Haven project to help house 40 people in need at a hotel in the Vancouver area. If you are interested in learning more about their organization and project, please visit their website at https://lumenfidelis.org/.
- Mike Burton spoke about Remember Everyone Deployed (RED) is for honoring United States service members currently deployed overseas and there are about 170k troops currently deployed.

Guest Speakers

• Ron Rasmussen, a former USAF officer presented information about a project to repurpose a section of Camp Bonneville for housing homeless Veterans, in collaboration with Do Good Multnomah, a 501(c)(3) non-profit with experience in this field. Camp Bonneville, a 4000-acre former US Army site, is currently owned by Clark County. The proposal envisions housing fifty homeless Veterans in semi-permanent structures, progressing through Emergency, Transitional, Permanent Supportive, and On Your Own phases. He shared the proposed project has garnered support from the Washington Trails Association, Windhaven Horse Therapy, and three Clark County Council members. Next steps will include collaboration with Clark County, reviewing transfer documents, engaging with the Washington State Department of Veterans Affairs, and seeking a variance with US Representative Marie Gluesenkamp-Perez. Ron shared Do Good Multnomah has comprehensive case management capabilities, complemented by a team of licensed professional counselors and a background in food services. The organization is actively involved in serving around six hundred homeless individuals across multiple

locations in Portland. They recently opened, authorized, and supervised tiny-house encampment in Vancouver, with plans for a second site. Camp Bonneville would be their third site within Clark County.
